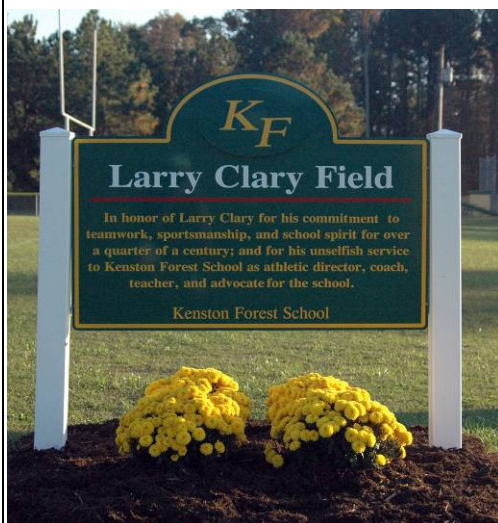
On Friday 21 October, Kenston Forest School and its Alumni honored retired Athletic Director Larry Clary with his own day. The day's festivities began with lunch. The Alumni Association prepared Coach's favorite: hot dogs, cole slaw, chips and homemade ice cream (churned by Bobby Daniels' antique gas engine-powered ice cream maker). Over 400 hotdogs were served. The lunch was free to the students, faculty and staff. At 6:00 a reception honoring Coach Clary was held in the gym lobby. Former players and other alumni enjoyed refreshments while reminiscing and sharing fond memories. Following the reception, guests gathered in the gym for a short program. President of the Board John Goode presented Coach Clary with a gift from the Board. The several hundred guests gave Coach a standing ovation.

The varsity football team entered the gym for part of the ceremony to honor Coach. In typical Coach Clary fashion, he turned it around and had the crowd give the players a cheer. "I expect ya'll boys to get after it and get a win tonight" added Clary.
